Mental Health Support

We have let parents know that Sarah has joined Rebecca in the school's wellbeing team as a Mental Health Practitioner. Sarah has started to speak with a number of students across her three days at work.

Parents can ask for a referral for their child from their teacher or from the front Office if they believe that speaking with Sarah will support their child's wellbeing.

When the referral has been accepted Sarah will be in contact with the parents to discuss a plan moving forward. The role includes:

mental health prevention and promotion

- · short term support for students including direct counselling
- · coordinating supports with other services for students with complex needs.

NDIS Support

One of the many jobs that Rebecca has at the school is to speak with parents about NDIS. Whilst the school does not deal with the NDIS directly, Rebecca is able to assist parents in

- · Support you to understand the:

o Structure of the NDIS and how to navigate and engage with the system

- o Ongoing management of NDIS plans and how to raise questions or concerns with the NDIA or NDIS funded organisations
- Assist you to access NDIS Local Area Coordination partners for advice and support
